As I write the first magazine letter of 2026, the decorations have been packed away at the Vicarage and even the Christmas chocolates are a distant memory. My mind has turned to plans for a New Year, but officially in the church calendar Christmas isn't finished until early February. I'm not one of those people who "wish it could be Christmas everyday" but a beautiful poem by Howard Thurman started me thinking about the legacy of Christmas.

***The Work of Christmas by Howard Thurman***

*When the song of the angels is stilled,  
When the star in the sky is gone,  
When the kings and princes are home,  
When the shepherds are back with their flock,  
The work of Christmas begins:*

*To find the lost, To heal the broken,  
To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner,  
To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among brothers,  
To make music in the heart.*

Sadly, the peace we sang of in our Christmas carols seems like a dream as many people live under the shadow of violence. Who could have imagined that 2026 would have begun with the capture of the Venezuelan President and threats from the USA to intervene in Greenland, using force if necessary? It is easy to feel disheartened, frightened and vulnerable as these events are outside our control. However, the birth of Christ reveals God's love entering the world in vulnerability and hope. Making Christmas last all year means allowing that love to shape our daily choices long after we've taken the tree down. It means noticing who is overlooked and choosing to see them. It means responding to brokenness — in our families, our community, and our world — not with indifference or despair, but with compassion and courage. Across our villages, this "work of Christmas" is already happening in quiet, faithful ways: meals shared, prayers offered, visits made, justice sought, forgiveness practiced. These acts may not look spectacular, but they are holy. They are how the light of Christmas continues to shine in ordinary time.

We are going to face increasing challenges to hold on to hope and live courageously and generously in coming months. Thurman's poem reminds us that peace begins within. To "make music in the heart" is to nurture an

inner life rooted in God — one that resists fear, cynicism, and bitterness. From that place, our outward actions gain depth and integrity. We become people who carry Christmas with us into workplaces, homes, and conversations.

As we move through the year, we might like to return again to the question “What is the work of Christmas now?” The answer will look different for each of us, but the invitation is the same — to live as people who believe that God is still at work in the world, and that we are called to join in.

## **The Ark Café 10<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY exhibition**

Mike Lloyd FRPS, a local photographer, will be exhibiting his images and explaining the process by which he was awarded his fellowship; the highest distinction awarded by the Royal Photographic Society (founded in 1853) with present membership of 10,000.

Mike's images were taken in Glen Affric over a seven-year period and were offered for assessment to a panel of five expert judges and accepted in June 2025.

Glen Affric, nestled in the West Highlands of Scotland, is a protected nature reserve of 35,000 acres, of which 30% is forested. It is home to one of Scotland's most beautiful Glens. The images demonstrate seasonal shifts in the woodland – from the warm tones of autumn to the frosty stillness of winter and the subdued greens of early spring – capturing the landscape's quiet, changing palette.

Also on display will also be several of Mike's landscape images from Lofoten, Faroe Islands and the West Coast of Scotland. Local locations will also be featured – including images of Delamere Forest and Whitegate Way. These images will remain on display for a few months and are available for purchase as unmounted prints.

**Eco Matters**

February 2026

**Heralds of Spring!**

February's increasing hours of daylight and gently rising temperatures are a welcome reminder that spring isn't too far away. The Church festival of Candlemas, celebrated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> February, lies roughly half way between the winter solstice's longest night of the year (21<sup>st</sup> December) and the vernal equinox which heralds the first day of spring (20<sup>th</sup> March). February is the month when Snowdrops, once called Candlemas Bells, are blooming. They are amongst the first flowers to emerge after the winter, lifting the spirits with thoughts of the sunshine and birdsong to come. Snowdrops open their flowers when the air temperature reaches between 8 and 10 degrees Celsius, the same temperature range at which pollinating insects, especially bees, become active. The nectar produced by the snowdrop flowers is a welcome and necessary early food source for these insects. If you grow snowdrops, look out for these early pollinators visiting the flowers on sunny days. If you have lots of snowdrops in your garden, then splitting the clumps of grey-green leaves, once the snowdrops have finished flowering, and sharing them with your friends and neighbours to plant in their gardens is a great way of increasing the likelihood that next year's emerging bees will be able to find nectar wherever they fly.



**Sunday, February 15<sup>th</sup>:** you are welcome to join us for the **Take 40** service in church when the Eco Team will be reflecting further on seasonal changes as we move through winter into spring. The service starts at **6.30pm**.

## Church Wildlife Gardening Group

**Saturday, February 14<sup>th</sup> 2026, 10.00am-12.00 noon,**

Come and join us for a couple of hours in the fresh air as we work to improve the church garden as a habitat for local wildlife. This month, our tasks will suit all ages. We will replenish our bird feeders, clean out and top up the bird baths, check on the progress of the snowdrops that are growing on the holly bank and spend some time appreciating how amazing birds nest are. We will continue to remove some of the grass from the pollinator zone to allow the other plants there to receive more light as they begin to emerge from the soil and we'll prune the buddleias. Sturdy footwear and weatherproof clothing are essential and children must be accompanied by a responsible adult. If you have your own spade, fork or secateurs, please bring them with you. 

## Heritage Snippets



In St John's Baptistry there is a brass plaque in memory of Jabez Thompson and his wife Sarah. Jabez inherited the Terracotta Brickworks on Manchester Road, Northwich, from his father John Thompson. John had established several important salt and brick firms in the town. Examples of their impressive ornamental terracotta is to be found in London, Birmingham and all over the North West. Locally Jabez Thompson's works produced the decorative screen behind the altar at

Little Leigh Church which depicts Leonardo de Vinci's *Last Supper* and two large panels on the front of the former Verdin Technical school, Winsford. In 1890 Jabez built Abbotsford (see below) in Cuddington to John Douglas' design. Here he lived with his family until his death in 1911.


