#### A message from Revd. Ruth

Breakfast Church is the name of our intergenerational, creative worship that usually takes place at 10.15am on the first Sunday of the month. The Church Hall is set up with tables and chairs and our service begins with refreshments served from 9.45am. Our worship is led by the Breakfast Band and the service includes discussion and creative activities around tables alongside songs, prayers and a Bible story. It's a wonderful space for all ages to come together and worship God!



During the Autumn, the Breakfast Church congregation has been focusing on the story of Joseph found in the Old Testament. We've heard how Joseph was given a special coat by his father Jacob. and how this intensified the jealousy Joseph's brothers. In October we heard

how Joseph was sold as a slave in Egypt and how his gift for interpreting dreams brought him to the attention of Pharaoh. Our Breakfast Church service on 2nd November will use the final part of Joseph's story to talk about forgiveness and reconciliation when Joseph comes face to face with his brothers again. There are times when I struggle with the context, culture and violence of parts of the Old Testament, but the emotional reality of the story of Joseph as he tries to hold onto hope in God during the trials of life has been very powerful.

All are welcome to join us at **Breakfast Church** on **2nd November** and **7th December!** 












### St John's Sandíway

#### **Eco Matters**

#### Water

'Without fresh water, life on land wouldn't exist. It is the most precious resource on our planet, but it's finite. Every drop is vital for all species and us humans that rely upon it.' David Attenborough



The Environment Agency has said we are 30 years away from a daily public water shortage of 5 billion litres, climate change being a driving factor. The Uk expects bigger winter floods, summer flash floods and yet intense periods of drought will bring a decrease in summer river flows reducing water availability and quality. We in the northwest are included amongst the most vulnerable areas.

Around the world prolonged and frequent dry spells and periods of heavy rainfall are causing damage and disruption to water supplies through contamination, saltwater intrusion and scarcity. Low lying coastal areas are also extremely vulnerable to flooding whilst inland areas face severe floods interspersed with drought.

**We can act!** Charitable giving can help around the world whilst at home we can improve our water efficiency: fix leaks, take shorter showers, collect and use rainwater, plant a garden that can handle local conditions and maintain drains to reduce flooding.

Don't miss out, get your water butts ready now!

#### **Gardening Tips for November**

Now is a good time to plant tulip bulbs in beds or pots and bare-root roses, trees and shrubs. You can also plant garlic, shallots and onions in well draining soil or raised beds, they will need covering with fleece. Cut down any tatty looking perennials and put some mulch on the soil around them. Try to leave any seedheads on plants such as echinacea and teasels, sparrows and goldfinches will thank you. Planting up a pot

of crocuses now will help feed queen bumblebees in the Spring. It's a good time for general cleaning and tidying, the greenhouse if you have one and any pots that are finished with for the year. If you're having a bonfire please make sure to check it carefully before lighting to make sure there are no hedgehogs or other wildlife sheltering in it. Clean any bird feeders regularly to help avoid the spread of disease.

#### Wildlife Gardening

If you enjoy working in the fresh air and have some time to spare on Saturday, 8th November, why not join the church wildlife gardening group as they work to make the church grounds more wildlife-friendly? We work from 10.00-12.00, with a coffee break at half time. Please wear sturdy footwear, weather-appropriate clothing and if you can, bring your own spade or trowel.

#### Walk and Wonder

Sunday, 16th November 2025. 2.00pm. Join us for a gentle 4km stroll as we take in some of the wonders of the nature on our doorstep. Meet at the exit of the village car park at 2.00pm. Please wear sturdy footwear and weather-appropriate clothing.

#### **COP 30**

The 2025 United Nations Climate Change Conference, (known as COP30 because it is 30 years since the 1st such gathering) will be held in Brazil, from November 10-21 November. It will bring together world leaders, scientists, non-government organisations and other civilian groups to discuss priority actions to tackle climate change.

## Heritage Snippets



John Moore

The construction of St John's was not without mishap. On Thursday October 2<sup>nd</sup> 1903, when working at the site, John Moore, a joiner from Manor Lodge, Hartford, slipped and fell ten feet from a ladder, sustaining an 'angular eight inch cut on his head'. He was treated at Northwich surgery by Dr Armstrong before being allowed to go home to recover.

At home was his second wife Eliza (50 years); Albert, a son from his first marriage (23); Frank, John and Eliza's own child (5); and his stepson, Albert Armstrong (15). Other children from John's first marriage were William, John, Hannah, Annie and Thomas. The last two died in 1878 at five and eight. When the accident happened, John was 63 and the head

foreman for Messrs Becket and Co, the building contractors employed by John Douglas. The owner of the outfit, Richard Becket, was John Douglas' brother-inlaw, who was married to his elder sister, Elizabeth. John died in 1905 but whether the fall had any lasting impact on his health, isn't known. *Jill King*




